

SAVMA One Health Project – Start-Up Fund Application

Thank you for your interest in the SAVMA One Health Project. All schools are eligible for \$700 in start-up funds once annually (year of eligibility runs from SAVMA Symposium to SAVMA Symposium in Spring). If you are curious whether or not your school is eligible for the current year, please visit: http://bit.ly/SAVMAonehealthfundingavailability.

REQUIREMENTS FOR FUNDING:

- -- Funds are only available to SCAVMA chapters at accredited veterinary schools (either through the SCAVMA directly, as a joint SCAVMA & club activity, or by a non-SCAVMA club with approval from the SCAVMA)
- -- Complete the following form (reviewed by the SAVMA Global and Public Health Officer). Please review the entire application before you begin so that you have all of the required information.
- -- Submit a follow-up event report form and photos in a timely manner, within 30 days of the completion of the event (access the form here: http://bit.ly/SAVMAonehealthEventReportForm; event photos should be submitted to savmagpho@qmail.com)

APPLICATION DEADLINES:

- -- Start-up fund applications are accepted on a continuous basis. Each school is eligible for \$700 once annually (between each spring SAVMA Symposium). To check your school's eligibility, visit: http://bit.ly/SAVMAonehealthfundingavailability.
- Funding must be used during the current funding cycle (between each annual spring SAVMA Symposia). All events and reports must be completed before the annual spring Symposium.

ADDITIONAL FUNDING:

- -- competitive grants are available based on the merit of events and quality of applications; more information available at: http://bit.ly/SAVMAonehealthGrantFundsApp (grants are available each semester and typically range from \$500-\$3000 per award, depending on the number and quality of applications)
- -- the GHLIT offers additional funding from time to time; more information available at

REQUIREMENTS FOR FUNDING:

- Funds are only available to SCAVMA (Student Chapters of the American Veterinary Medical Association) chapters at accredited veterinary schools
 - Not a SCAVMA organization? Consider contacting students at a local vet school to see if you can start up a joint project! One health is all about collaboration.
- Complete the application form
- If you receive a grant, make sure you submit a follow-up event report form and photos within 30 days of the completion of the event

APPLICATION DEADLINES:

- Start-up fund applications are accepted on a continuous basis. Each school is eligible for \$700 once annually.
 - Not restricted to SCAVMA- can be club with SCAVMA or non-SCAVMA group with SCAVMA permission! Also not restricted to One Health/Public Health Clubs! It just needs to be a One Health Project.
- Funding must be used during the current funding cycle (between each annual spring SAVMA Symposia).

ADDITIONAL FUNDING:

Competitive grants are available based on the merit of events and quality of applications (grants are available each semester and typically range from \$500-\$3000 per award, depending on the number and quality of applications)
