

Dr. Kaufman is a wildlife veterinarian, One Health educator and President of the non-profit organization Veterinary Initiative for Endangered Wildlife (VIEW). She serves on the Council of Advisors for the One Health Commission and is a member of the One Health Education Task Force. Previously she was Assistant Director for Global Health Education and Training at the Paul G. Allen School for Global Animal Health at Washington State University and Director of the Tufts Center for Conservation Medicine where she headed up the master's program in conservation medicine. Dr. Kaufman has conducted international veterinary medical research and service projects in Nepal since 2001. She

works with the Nepal veterinary community, the national veterinary school at the Institute for Agriculture and Animal Science (IAAS) and various animal welfare institutions to promote dog sterilization and rabies vaccination in the country. She also collaborates with Elephant Care International, the National Trust for Nature Conservation (Nepal), and the Department of National Parks and Wildlife Conservation (Nepal) on various wildlife health research and capacity building projects. Dr. Kaufman advocates for the critical need for inclusion of wildlife health in endangered species conservation efforts and the need to seek sustainable solutions to global health challenges facing the world today. She strongly defends the protection of biodiversity as a fundamental key to the health of the planet and all life that benefits from it.
