





As the Facts & Figures section in your July 2015 issue illustrates, Cuba's global health collaboration programs between 1959 and 2015 demonstrate foresight and political will in prioritizing health education and disease prevention across geographic borders.^[1] Cuba's public health mission is health professional education with a focus on primary preventive health care, which has impacted the delivery of quality health care services for the Cuban population and for countries enduring conflicts, disease outbreaks and natural disasters.

When WHO's Director General, Dr. Margaret Chan, visited Cuba in July 2014, she was impressed with the prevention-based model as a foundation of the health care system with links to health research and development. Touted as a model for effective universal health coverage over the past several decades, Cuba was an ideal setting to host Cuba Salud 2015, an international public health convention whose theme, "Health for all: universal coverage," convened international research exchanges to highlight evidence-based practices for diagnosis, prevention and control of chronic and infectious diseases with effective service delivery models. Social determinants of health were discussed with respect to related barriers to health equity and optimal population health.

Second, disease surveillance records are carefully recorded at municipal and provincial levels, allowing timely assessments of community health needs and disparities. Multidisciplinary clinical teams – basic work groups – evaluate community needs for prompt interventions. Third, through community participation, individuals and organisations are motivated to be active leaders in their families and communities in disease prevention programmes. Community groups, such as the Committee for the Defense of the Revolution (CDFR) or Federation of Cuban Women (FMC), have organised regular exercise classes in parks and increased compliance rates to vaccinations and sexual and reproductive health screenings.³ With emerging threats of novel pathogens and antibiotic resistance, all nations should prioritise cost-effective, community-based prevention programmes that aim to minimise threats of infectious pathogens at home. High population literacy and patient compliance rates, coupled with strong doctor-patient relationships, are advantageous in building community engagement towards a collective vision of healthy families.

First, communities should be encouraged to take ownership of environmental protection and hygienic practices to control rodent invasion into urban dwellings and reduce rodent breeding areas,¹ and to promptly refer cases with concerning symptoms to health facilities. Second, health authorities should prioritise annual training of health workers in the application of universal safety precautions for infection control and regular epidemic response drills, with periodic evaluations. Third, policy makers should provide a description of disease signs and symptoms in local languages, promote culturally appropriate health improvement practices, and publicise toll-free telephone lines for systematic reporting and surveillance. Fourth, the One Health approach² should be applied to minimise human health risks by advocating for environmental sustainability, reduced bush burning practices, and preservation of vector habitats.



Points to Consider

- Check the **Table of Contents** of the scientific journals – Any interesting topics?
- Review the **Author's Guidelines** – Any date or other restrictions?
- Review previously published **Letters to the Editor** – Any specific format to follow?


