Bi-Partisan One Health Congressional Bills introduced in U.S. <u>Senate</u> and <u>House</u> aim to establish an interagency One Health Program.

Senate Bill S.1903, "Advancing Emergency Preparedness Through One Health Act of 2019' was introduced in the US Senate on June 19, 2019, by Senators Tina Smith and Todd Young. This was followed on July 16, 2019 with introduction of a bill by the same name in the House of Representatives by Representatives Kurt Schrader and Ted Yoho.

These companion bills push a coordinated "One Health" approach to better prevent, prepare for, and respond to zoonotic disease outbreaks. The bills call for appropriate federal departments and agencies to establish a national One Health Framework to coordinate Federal activities under the One Health Program.
